From May 14 to May 16, the first edition of the Festival d'Histoire de Montréal will present programming organized by unconventional themes designed to attract a large, diverse audience. Some **thirty** organizations dedicated to history and heritage, including the 14 Montreal History Museums, are presenting **36 different activities**, some in person and some online. The majority of them are being offered **free of charge**.

Programming will also take place in several parts of the city, broadening the Festival's impact and giving it a unique profile.
